Zone Colour	Services & Programming	Additional Notes for Intervenors
Green - Prevent	<p>Intervenors will screen before coming to work and once at the work place will complete the self-assessment questionnaire.</p> <p>Intervenors will wear a mask and face shield, as per the memo dated Dec. 1</p> <p>When in the community, physical distancing from members of the public must be maintained and the individual must wear a mask/face covering.</p> <p>Below are examples of the types of activities that an individual living in a green zone may plan as part of their regular programming. In most cases, the business/venue is responsible for ensuring that maximum limits are not exceeded. Intervenors are expected to assess the number of people involved and to avoid crowded events/situations.</p> <p>Gatherings and events</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Organized social events, e.g. birthday party, baby/bridal shower, dinner party (10 people max) • Attending services at a church/synagogue/mosque/temple or other venue (30% of capacity max.) • Attending a wedding (30% of venue capacity max.) • Attending a funeral (30% of venue capacity max.) <p>Note: Intervenors working in family homes will not be able to provide services if a family gathering exceeds the above maximum limits. 

Yellow - Protect	<p>Intervenors will screen before coming to work and once at the work place will complete the self-assessment questionnaire.</p> <p>Intervenors will wear a mask and face shield, as per the memo dated Dec. 1</p> <p>When in the community, physical distancing from members of the public must be maintained and the individual must wear a mask/face covering.</p> <p>Travel to another community in a green colour zone is discouraged.</p> <p>Below are examples of the types of activities that an individual living in a yellow zone may plan as part of their regular programming. In most cases, the business/venue is responsible for ensuring that maximum limits are not exceeded. Intervenors are expected to assess the number of people involved and to avoid crowded events/situations.</p> <p>Gatherings and events</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Organized social events, e.g. birthday party, baby/bridal shower, dinner party (10 people max) • Attending services at a church/synagogue/mosque/temple or other venue (30% of capacity max.) • Attending a wedding (30% of venue capacity max.) • Attending a funeral (30% of venue capacity max.) <p>Note: Intervenors working in family homes will not be able to provide services if a family gathering exceeds the above maximum limits. In most cases, the business/venue is responsible for ensuring that maximum limits are not exceeded. Red - Control	<p>Intervenors will screen before coming to work and once at the work place will complete the self-assessment questionnaire.</p> <p>Intervenors will wear a mask and face shield, as per the memo dated Dec. 1</p> <p>When in the community, physical distancing from members of the public must be maintained and the individual must wear a mask/face covering.</p> <p>Travel to another community in a green, yellow or orange zone is discouraged.</p> <p>Note: Travel Intervenor Services Coordinators will not visit the program in person. Instead, they will be connecting with the individual/family and the intervenors by phone or through virtual meetings.</p> <p>Below are examples of the types of activities that an individual living in a red zone may plan as part of their regular programming. In most cases, the business/venue is responsible for ensuring that maximum limits are not exceeded. Intervenors are expected to assess the number of people involved and to avoid crowded events/situations.</p> <p>Gatherings and events</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Organized social events, e.g. birthday party, baby/bridal shower, dinner party (only among the members of the household, no visitors allowed) • Attending services at a church/synagogue/mosque/temple or other venue (30% of capacity max.) • Attending a wedding (30% of venue capacity max.) • Attending a funeral (30% of venue capacity max.) <p>Note: Intervenors working in family homes will not be able to provide services if a family gathering includes visitors. The intervenor is to remove themselves to a safe place and then notify their supervisor or the on-call supervisor.</p> <p>Gatherings that include visitors will not be planned in any of Sensity's residential settings.</p> <p>Community outings must be restricted to essential reasons only – work, school, groceries, pharmacies, health care and exercise/physical activity.</p>	Participant count must include intervenor(s)

Grey - Lockdown	<p>Intervenors will screen before coming to work and once at the work place will complete the self-assessment questionnaire.</p> <p>Intervenors will wear a mask and face shield, as per the memo dated Dec. 1</p> <p>When in the community, physical distancing from members of the public must be maintained and the individual receiving services must wear a mask/face covering.</p> <p>Community-based activities will be restricted in regions designated as Grey-Lockdown. Below are examples of the types of activities that an individual living in a grey zone may plan as part of their regular programming. Refer to Zone definitions for maximum number of participants. In most cases, the business/venue is responsible for ensuring that maximum limits are not exceeded. Intervenors are expected to assess the number of people involved and to avoid crowds.</p> <p>Gatherings and events</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Organized social events, e.g. birthday party, baby/bridal shower, dinner party, within own household only <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ This means that within a household (either a family home setting, an apartment or other residential setting) the people living there may have an event such as described. ○ In a family home setting, if physical distancing cannot be maintained and if the individual receiving services is not able to wear a mask/face covering, then the family members must be wearing a mask. If they are unable to do that, the individual and intervenor must not participate in the event. ○ In a residential setting, where 2 or more individuals receiving services live together, the event may be planned only if physical distancing can be maintained and the individuals are able to wear a mask/face covering. <p>Note: Intervenors working in family homes <u>will not</u> be able to provide services if a family gathering includes visitors. The intervenor is to remove themselves to a safe place and then notify their supervisor or the on-call supervisor.</p> <p>Gatherings that include visitors will not be planned in any of Sensity's residential settings.</p>	<p>When providing intervenor services, the intervenor is considered part of the household</p>

	<p>Community outings must be restricted to essential reasons only – health care and exercise/physical activity.</p> <p>Sports & Recreational Fitness Facilities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Use outdoor recreational amenities only (e.g. walking or hiking trails/skating/ski hill/snow trails) <p>Stores & Personal Care Services</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• In-person shopping is not permitted. Sensity will continue to manage the grocery shopping for individuals in residential settings and community settings, with costs being invoiced to the individuals. Because of the lockdown, personal needs items may once again be included in the grocery orders.• No personal care services (haircut, massage, manicure, etc.)	<p>Maintain social distancing if using public trails</p>
