The Brant County Health Unit declared an outbreak at Sensity in Paris on Tuesday, April 13 following the positive test of a staff member for COVID-19. Provincial government guidelines require an outbreak be declared when a single positive case among staff or residents is reported at congregate living settings.

We are working closely with the Brant County Health Unit (BCHU) to coordinate contact tracing and any necessary COVID-19 testing for people we support and staff.

We are grateful to Brantford Brant Paramedics for attending Sensity on Tuesday, April 13 to conduct testing of people in our services.

At this time, all people we support remain healthy.

We are unable to identify the individual who tested positive due to the confidential nature of the medical information. The person is in isolation at home and our thoughts and wishes are with our team member for a full and speedy recovery.

Please note, the Sensity Resource Centre remains closed to the public during the current Stay-at-Home order enacted by the provincial government. In addition, all family visits to our congregate care settings remain suspended.
